#### A Note from Pastor Stuart

This year I'm planning for the Christmas Eve services to preach on the promise from the angels, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" Peace is certainly something we all need. It brings to mind an amazing event that took place in 1914 in the midst of the brutality of the first World War. On Christmas Eve the fighting had stopped and soldiers on both sides hunkered down in their fox holes to face



another long, cold night. Instead of being together with friends and family on this most special night, they were in the service of their individual countries in muddy, dirty and sometimes bloody holes in the ground. They huddled together on that night and passed around bottles to push away the sadness and the cold.

They say it started with combined Christmas carols, each sung in their own language. And then slowly men left their foxholes from both sides, without their weapons. They exchanged small gifts such as food, tobacco, alcohol, and souvenirs. They showed each other pictures of their families. It hardly sounds possible, but they actually spent Christmas Day together, an unofficial truce being called on this most holy day, no matter from which country they came. And then sadly the day after, they returned to their foxholes to continue the war in which each believed.

That Christmas story embodies a simple truth. When we experience fear and hardships, when we're lonely during the holidays, when we deal with the frustration of families or whatever challenge you might be facing, the Christmas story has the power of hope. We have the simple hope that God came among us to pour His love upon us. Invite someone else and make time yourself to come and sing those familiar words, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight!"

## **Social Ministry News**

Our next Living-Love-Lunch meal packing event date is **Tuesday**, **December 10** at 6:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall. We'll be preparing 50 lunches of sandwiches, a drink, fruit, chips and cookies for the homeless in Chester. If you're able to lend a hand, please join us.

Also, with winter around the corner we are collecting men's gently used athletic shoes and work boots and sleeping bags for the homeless. Look for the collection bin under the hallway tables.

We had a great turn out of children and adults and filled 53 Thanksgiving baskets together with chickens and delivered them to those in need at the Care Center Foundation in West Chester.

We also filled 300 Thrivent reusable food bags with Thanksgiving dinners for all of the Honey Brook Food Pantry members. A big thank you to Thrivent for helping out and providing our pizza lunch.

Also, for the Honey Book Food pantry we are collecting winter coats for adults and children. There's a collection box in the narthex, so if you're able to help, please drop your donations there.

We continue to collect gently used flat sheets for our Baby Care Kits. We can use the flannel sheets to make diapers and the cotton sheets can be used for making quilts. There is a collection bin in the narthex under the tables.

Our Crafters hosted a candy-making session and made 40 boxes of chocolate turtles to sell at Thanksgiving. Proceeds help pay for materials to make baby blankets that go to Lutheran World Relief, and Christmas stockings for the children attending the daycare center at the Care Foundation in West Chester.

We had our first pop-up thrift store meeting to fundraise for local charities and renovations to the parsonage. We had 12 interested attendees and came away with great ideas and suggestions. Crafters usually meet on Wednesdays at 10 am. They now meet in the downstairs area of the church (former preschool area). All are welcome!



## **Thanksgiving Food Boxes Thank You Notes**





Conductor Cheryl Markofski is a graduate of Florida State University with a master of music degree who has done graduate work in voice performance at the University of Texas. She taught music at the Owen J Roberts Middle School and is a noted soloist and voice coach. Accompanist Eleanor Lundy, a member of St. John's, began playing the piano by ear in early childhood. She has taught piano and served churches in New England and eastern Pennsylvania for many years as a choir director and organist. She is a graduate of Rosemont College.

The Coventry Singers is a community choral organization of auditioned singers who perform diverse and challenging choral music. Over its 50-year history, the group has performed major choral works, including those of Handel, Bach, Mozart, Haydn, Rutter, and Finzi. The Coventry Singers concert programs also include lighter works, both sacred and secular, with a frequent dose of humor. The number of performers ranges from 30 to 40 and includes people of all walks of life. Some have

professional musical experience, some are or have been teachers of music, but many are people who just like to sing and welcome musical challenges.

Children and adults all gathered together to share some Halloween fun!






# Sunday, November 2 - Crafters Candy Making
