#### **A Note from Pastor Stuart**

#### The Purpose Driven Life, Part 2

We all know that growing in faith is at the heart of being a Christian, but exactly how do we do this? Especially if you're new to faith, or restarting your faith journey, how exactly do you grow? Or even for those who have been people of faith for many years, describing it in a simple manner is often difficult.



Rick Warren, pastor of one of the largest congregations in the country, felt this same lack of guidance as he worked with thousands of people coming to his church in California. So he decided to write a book describing five simple "purposes" or ways we grow in faith. It wasn't a revolutionary book because everyone knew these five purposes: worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry, and mission. They are often repeated in the Bible, and saints through the ages have engaged in them for thousands of years. But Warren's book, <a href="The Purpose Driven Life">The Purpose Driven Life</a>, presented these "purposes" in a simple manner and he helpfully wrote forty very short chapters so you could read one a day. The book was a runaway best seller on the New York Times Bestseller List for over 90 weeks and ultimately it sold over 50 million copies.

All this is why we'll be reading <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u> together this fall! (It also meshes really well with our recent Vision Plan, which I <u>wrote about last month</u>.) And on each Sunday I'll preach a message to get us ready on the upcoming topic. Furthermore, we're offering discussion groups at different times and places where you can make friends and talk about what you are reading.

## **Update on Space Usage**

Hi St. Paul's,

Earlier this year, church council sent a survey to all the committees and teams about their space needs at the Church. We have spent a good bit of time reviewing those responses and figuring out how to best utilize the church facilities.

You'll likely start seeing some of the changes taking place in August to get ready for church activities that resume in the Fall. Some changes may take a bit longer to implement. Here is a summary of several of the changes you will soon start to see.

- Craig Miller will be relocating his office from the 2nd floor to either Pastor Mark's old office or to the first floor library (did you know we had a library? I didn't).
- Craig's current office will become a classroom / meeting room.
- The large pre-school area will be utilized by Sunday school and the crafters/quilters. It will also be available for general use.
- Room 102 will be used by the older Sunday school class on Sunday mornings. This class had previously met in the Fellowship Hall.
- Classroom 207 (the large one with the windows that had been used by the pre-school) will be used as a large meeting room and for adult faith formation on Sunday mornings.
- The choir room will be converted into a youth room with sofas, love seats and chairs. The room will be used for confirmation on Sunday mornings and by our youth groups.
- Classroom 204 (the long narrow one across from Lyndsey's office) will become the new music storage room. Thank you, Lyndsey for being very flexible!
- Social Ministry is going to be using the first floor of the parsonage for a new idea they have. I won't spoil their surprise / announcement. They'll be sharing the space with the Amigos and property team.

#### **MUSIC MINISTRIES FOR CHILDREN AND TEENS:**

**Sunday School Music:** Each Sunday as part of Sunday School, children preschool through 5th grade start their Sunday School time with music. 
## **Social Ministry**
